Treasurer's Annual Report for 2018

This is my third Annual Report as Treasurer. It has been my honor to volunteer with the rest of Council in managing the financial affairs of the church. I want to especially acknowledge that I am very much aided in my responsibilities by Jeanne Taylor, who has continued to handle the responsibility for aggregating and paying our various bills on a timely basis. Her contribution has been invaluable and has allowed me to focus on my primary responsibilities which consists of (1) making sure our financial transactions are properly categorized and reported to Council on a monthly basis and (2) financial risk management.

Overview of 2018 Results

In my opinion, we continue to be in an enviable position financially given our young age and relatively small size. Grace UCC was started in 2004 and has been in existence for only 14 years. Here are the key areas I would highlight.

A. Attendance

Year to date, we've averaged about 33 attendees to our Sunday worship service. That is a noteworthy decrease from past years... (Dec 2018 projected)

Starting in November, we embarked upon a laddered purchase program of one year bank certificate of deposits. Each month for the next eleven months, it is our plan to purchase an additional \$2,700 in one year CD's. We expect to receive over \$600 in additional annual investment income, starting in November of next year.

C. Mission spending

Our year to date mission spending has totaled \$20,108.30. That mission spending was spread over our four restricted accounts and our regular operating account (as shown below).

Mission related stewardship plea: The total projected mission spending for the year is \$26,162.30. That level of spending proves that the need for support in our community persists. Our church has a big heart. And we've been walking the talk. In order for Grace to continue to be a beacon of hope for families in need, it is important that our members go beyond their normal year end catch up payments. We need members to go beyond "catch up" donations to a more "make up" donation posture. Members need to help the church "make up" some of the growing financial gap among families in need in our community. Increased donations would be very helpful to our Emergency Mission Fund (EMF). The EMF is a restricted account used exclusively for mission spending that develops on an emergency basis.

D. Risk Management

Our insurance carrier, Church Mutual, has taken steps to support their insured churches who are trying to develop procedures to reduce the risk of armed intruders. Church Council reviewed the recommendations of our insurance company and established a good dialogue with our local law enforcement authorities. Armed Intruder training, open to the entire congregation, was conducted this year by Detective Kevin Burd, the Head of the SWAT team for Hunterdon County. Church Council continues to develop a formal Safety Plan which is expected to be published and implemented after the first of the year. Paul Anzano has been spearheading that effort with Council.

E. Financial Results

So far this year, we've had an operating loss of (\$5,028.17) in our unrestricted accounts. But if December donations follow the patterns seen in previous years, I project we will essentially break even for the year (\$100). Our budget for the year was a \$600 improvement in our surplus. So we will miss that budget by only \$700. (See page 6 for the detail line items.)

Please remember, in addition to having total assets (both restricted and unrestricted) of \$76,458.92, we do not have any debt or other significant obligations. So despite the small (\$100) financial shortfall being projected for the year in our unrestricted accounts, we continue to be financially stable, with low risk of a significant shock to our balance sheet.

F. Financial Strength

We have no debt burden and minimal facility maintenance. We don't own a building. We don't have a mortgage obligation. And we don't have significant facility maintenance costs. We are blessed to have a good relationship with the Flemington Women's Center and the use of their facility every Sunday morning at a very attractive price.

G. Financial Threat

Currently, a significant portion of our revenue comes from a very small number of members. That is not unusual, especially for a relatively new church with a small membership base. But the decrease in attendance in our Sunday worship service is a cause for concern. And it exacerbates the financial risk of having a significant portion of our donations coming from a very small number of our members. That point has come into even more focus as a result of one of our key families moving away to North Carolina this month. It would be advisable for all us to make every effort to grow our donor base/membership in order to reduce the donation concentration risk on a small number of households.

2018 Annual Report- Pastor Report

INTRODUCTION

Exactly thirteen (December 4, 2004) years ago we began the community of Grace United Church of Christ. Thirteen years and many wonderful, exciting, and blessed things have happened in our community.

Serving Justice, Loving Kindness: Grace UCC's mission statement is alive and well. We continue to refer to that statement, along with No Matter Who You Are or Where You Are on Life's Journey You Are Welcome Here as we name who and what we are as a church and community gathered together. It has been and continues to be an honor to work with each and every one of you. I truly believe Grace United Church of Christ takes to heart its mission and its vision. As such, we continue to be a welcoming and vibrant community.

The year 2018 has been an eventful one, filled with great worship experiences, bible studies, laity worship, council meetings, fellowship, interfaith gatherings, community dinners, breakfasts, and mission and outreach work- just to name a few.



WORSHIP/SUNDAY

Shelly is our music coordinator and we are grateful for her ministry. We have been blessed with her gifts as well as she leads the church with our music programs. Of note, if you have something to sing or play, Shelly is always open to your participation!

This year we have seen the continuation and refinement of laity worship, where one Sunday per month (usually the last Sunday of each month) we are blessed with the laity leading every aspect of the worship experience. I have enjoyed the different voices and messages as well. This has been met with wonderful praise as we not only hear and give witness to many different voices in the church but give testimony to the concept of "the priesthood of all believers". (If you would like to participate, let Christine S. know as she organizes these Sundays and we are fortunate to have her in this role.)

In conjunction with the laity worship, 2018 continues to have three communion leaders on those laity Sundays. This is a three-year cycle, with our being in the third year for Chris Syltevik, and Bill Taylor, and Marianne F. Marianne replaces John S. as the Schupners move back to NC (we will miss you all!). If you are interested in being a communion leader, please speak with Dan. Thank you all for making Sunday such a wonderful experience!

In addition, to our Sunday worship we have had the children remain in worship and those 2nd grade and below leave after the Lord's Prayer and join Carol in the backroom for Story Circle. This has been going very well and we thank Carol for this as we continue our intergenerational worship experience.

As mentioned last year, if there is anyone who is interested in putting together and educational program for those between the grades of 3-8, please let us know. An idea would be for this age group to be offered a class at the same time the 9-12 graders are meeting, over in the office around 10:15 am each Sunday morning before church.



MISSIONS:

As we worship, as we study and learn, we also reach out and help. A simple word for this is "mission".

Two of my favorite passages of the bible are a) Matthew 25: 31 ff. where we are encouraged to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and visit those in prison; and b) James 2: 14ff. where it states, "So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead." Both of these passages are prophetic and we here at Grace do a lot to make our faith not dead, but alive. Here are but some examples from 2018:

- Pennies and Nickels: This continues to be a great and well-received program. Each Sunday there is a silver, *change bowl* that is sent around during the offering. In it is placed loose change that is later converted to the support of mission projects both local and global. Then, led by Christine O., the children are given a choice of projects to support. Hundreds of dollars have been donated!
- <u>Family Promise (FP):</u> Led by Bill T. we continue to help the homeless in Hunterdon County. From being a support church, to helping raise emergency funds, to helping with moves, we continued our assistance efforts to those in our community who are without homes and/ or struggling to make ends meet.
- <u>Child/ Elder Sponsorship:</u> We, as a congregation, support both a child named Messia via the Christian Children's Fund and an elder named Ms. Lhako. You get a chance to support this effort each Sunday as a small bag with their names is passed around during the offering.
- <u>Flemington Food Pantry:</u> Led by Elaine, we bring needed items for the local food pantry to church the last Sunday of each month. They are then brought to the pantry and distributed to those who are in need. We continue to see more and more support with this effort and it is greatly appreciated. (If possible, try to remember to pick up a few items whenever you are at the grocery store and bring them to church...)
- <u>Coalition for Peace Action:</u> Led by Peter, we continue to be involved with supporting the peace coalition. We are also a co-sponsor of their yearly conference held in Princeton.
- Another wonderful mission project every year is the <u>Angel Patrol program</u> where Christmas gifts are given to families and children. Thank you, Bill T., for leading this effort!
- We are a "<u>Five for Five</u>" congregation which means we support the greater denomination (UCC) in their five wider offerings, which are:



- 1: UCC Basic Support (OCWM- Our Church's Wider Mission): Provides funding from congregations for Conferences and the national ministries of the United Church of Christ (Wider Church Ministries, Local Church Ministries, Justice and Witness Ministries, General Ministries, and Pension Boards).
- 2: One Great Hour of Sharing (Fourth Sunday in Lent): Channels resources for international programs in health, education and agricultural development, emergency relief, refugee ministries, and both international and domestic disaster response, administered by Wider Church Ministries, Global Sharing of Resources.
- **3:** Strengthen the Church (Pentecost Sunday): Supports leadership for new and revitalizing congregations, programs for youth and young adults, and leadership development for the whole church. UCC Conference and Local Church Ministries carry out these ministries.
- **4:** Neighbors in Need (First Sunday in October): Supports ministries of justice and comparison throughout the United States and Puerto Rico, including the Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM), justice and advocacy, and direct service projects supported by Justice and Witness Ministries.
- **5:** The Christmas Fund (Sunday before Christmas): Helps provide pension and health premium supplementation to low-income retired church workers, emergency assistance to clergy families in need, and Christmas checks to hundreds of annuitants, as administered by the Pension Boards.



FELLOWSHIP

In addition to these mission projects we have wonderful fellowship. From potlucks, to breakfasts to dinners, we continue to develop and grow, in large part, because of the relationships we share and nurture. Of note:

- Men's Breakfast: At least once per month, the men in the church are invited to gather for breakfast at the Country Griddle in Flemington. The socialization and laughter is very welcome.
- Epiphany Party: held every year at Dan and Mary Kate's.
- Community Dinners continue as well- thank you Marianne!

EDUCATION

- Story Circle during worship for those 2nd grade and below. Thank you, Carol J, for hosting and sharing those important Bible stories!
- A great Affirmation/ Confirmation program this year- Gabrielle and Malik were confirmed. Robert and Liza D., along with Geoff affirmed their faith!
- Adult Bible Study:
 - -Wed. (9:30 am.) adult study meets at Grateful Bites in Flemington.
 - -Wednesday evening Bible Study meets at the church office at 7 pm.

These small groups continue to be great gatherings of support as we question, learn and process our faith and life journeys.



COUNCIL
