# 2016 Annual Report- Pastor Report

#### **INTRODUCTION**

Exactly twelve (December 4, 2004) years ago we began the community of Grace United Church of Christ. Twelve years and many wonderful, exciting, and blessed things have happened in our community.

Serving Justice, Loving Kindness: Grace UCC's mission statement is alive and well. We continue to refer to that statement, along with No Matter Who You Are or Where You Are on Life's Journey You Are Welcome Here as we name who and what we are as a church and community gathered together. It has been and continues to be an honor to work with each and every one of you. I truly believe Grace United Church of Christ takes to heart its mission and its vision. As such, we continue to be a welcoming and vibrant community.

The year 2016 has been an eventful one, filled with great worship experiences, bible studies, laity worship, council meetings, fellowship, interfaith gatherings, community dinners, breakfasts, and mission and outreach work- just to name a few.

#### **WORSHIP/SUNDAY**

Shelly is our music coordinator and we are grateful for her ministry. We have been blessed with her gifts as well as she leads the church with our music programs. Of note, if you have something to sing or play, Shelly is always open to your participation!

This year we have seen the continuation and refinement of laity worship, where one Sunday per month (usually the last Sunday of each month) we are blessed with the laity leading every aspect of the worship experience. I have enjoyed the different voices and messages as well. This has been met with wonderful praise as we not only hear and give witness to many different voices in the church but give testimony to the concept of "the priesthood of all believers". (If you would like to participate, let Kathleen S. know as she organizes these Sundays and we are fortunate to have her in this role.)

In conjunction with the laity worship, 2016 continues to have three licensed ministers preside at communion on those laity Sundays. This is a three-year cycle, with our being in the third year for Geoff Marsh, Chris Syltevik, and Bill Taylor as those in this role. If you are interested in being a licensed minister at Grace UCC for communion, please speak with Dan.

Thank you all for making Sunday such a wonderful experience!

In addition, to our Sunday worship we have had the children remain in worship and those 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and below leave after the Lord's Prayer and join Carol in the backroom for Story Circle. This has been going very well and we thank Carol for this as we continue our intergenerational worship experience.

As mentioned last year, if there is anyone who is interested in putting together and educational program for those between the grades of 3-8, please let us know. An idea would be for this age group to be offered a class at the same time the 9-12 graders are meeting, over in the office around 10:15 am each Sunday morning before church.

#### **MISSIONS**

As we worship, as we study and learn, we also reach out and help. A simple word for this is "mission".

Two of my favorite passages of the bible are a) Matthew 25: 31 ff. where we are encouraged to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and visit those in prison; and b) James 2: 14ff. where it states, "So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead." Both of these passages are prophetic and we here at Grace do a lot to make our faith not dead, but alive. Here are but some examples from 2011:

- <u>Habitat for Humanity</u>: we continue to support the local chapter (Raritan Valley) both financially and in our participation in at least one workday per year. Look for more workdays in the future! Thank you to all who are helping bring affordable and safe housing to those in need.
- <u>Can Help:</u> With the leadership of Ed and Chris this has been a great success in the past by collecting aluminum and helping to pay for needed items like oil and heat. However, given the price of aluminum, we have decided to suspend this program in 2016. Thank you Ed and Chris!
- Pennies and Nickels: This continues to be a great and well-received program. Each Sunday there is a silver, *change bowl* that is sent around during the offering. In it is placed loose change that is later converted to the support of mission projects both local and global. Then, led by Christine O., the children are given a choice of projects to support. This year four different charities were picked, being given a total of \$1,600!!
- Relay for Life: Led by the Schupners we had a great team and great turn out this year. This year's Relay was held again at the Hunterdon Central Regional High School and we had a great time. Thank you!
- <u>Family Promise (FP):</u> Led by Bill T. we continue to help the homeless in Hunterdon County. From being a support church, to helping raise emergency funds, to helping with moves, we continued our assistance efforts to those in our community who are without homes and/ or struggling to make ends meet.
- <u>Child/ Elder Sponsorship:</u> We, as a congregation, support both a child named Messia via the Christian Children's Fund and an elder named Ms. Lhako. You get a chance to support this effort each Sunday as a small bag with their names is passed around during the offering.
- <u>Flemington Food Pantry:</u> Led by Elaine, we bring needed items for the local food pantry to church the last Sunday of each month. They are then brought to the pantry and distributed to those who are in need. We continue to see more and more support with this effort and it is greatly appreciated. (If possible, try to remember to pick up a few items whenever you are at the grocery store and bring them to church...)

- <u>Coalition for Peace Action:</u> Led by Peter, we continue to be involved with supporting the peace coalition. We are also a co-sponsor of their yearly conference held in Princeton.
- <u>SAFE in Hunterdon; Serving Women, Men and Families in Crisis</u>: We continue to support this organization both with their annual candlelight vigil (clergy participation) and, this and in future years, their *Men in Heels* program.
- Love the World: The Church Has Left the Building: now in its third year for Grace UCC, we were involved with a multi-church (in both Pennsylvania and New Jersey) event where local mission projects are done to, in part, show the church and the community the need to "leave the building" and help neighbors more often (which Grace does a great job at!).

This year we supported this effort via a great gathering at Grow-a-Row where we helped clear and clean a field this fall. (Thank you Bill T. for organizing this event.) The event culminated with a worship gathering at the Hopewell Methodist church where members from the churches involved gathered, sang and shared stories about how God touched them and their congregations during this event.

- Another wonderful mission project this year was our being able to obtain another grant which helped the Small family receive respite care. Thank you!
- We are a "Five for Five" congregation which means we support the greater denomination (UCC) in their five wider offerings, which are:
- 1: UCC Basic Support (OCWM- Our Church's Wider Mission): Provides funding from congregations for Conferences and the national ministries of the United Church of Christ (Wider Church Ministries, Local Church Ministries, Justice and Witness Ministries, General Ministries, and Pension Boards).
- 2: One Great Hour of Sharing (Fourth Sunday in Lent): Channels resources for international programs in health, education and agricultural development, emergency relief, refugee ministries, and both international and domestic disaster response, administered by Wider Church Ministries, Global Sharing of Resources.
- **3:** Strengthen the Church (Pentecost Sunday): Supports leadership for new and revitalizing congregations, programs for youth and young adults, and leadership development for the whole church. UCC Conference and Local Church Ministries carry out these ministries.
- **4:** Neighbors in Need (First Sunday in October): Supports ministries of justice and comparison throughout the United States and Puerto Rico, including the Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM), justice and advocacy, and direct service projects supported by Justice and Witness Ministries.
- **5:** The Christmas Fund (Sunday before Christmas): Helps provide pension and health premium supplementation to low-income retired church workers, emergency assistance to clergy families in need, and Christmas checks to hundreds of annuitants, as administered by the Pension Boards.

## **FELLOWSHIP**

In addition to these mission projects we have wonderful fellowship. From potlucks, to breakfasts to dinners, we continue to develop and grow, in large part, because of the relationships we share and nurture. Of note:

- Community Dinners: Led by Marianne, 2016 brought to us our eighth series of community dinners. This is where Grace UCC members and friends hosted a dinner where others from the church gathered and shared community and a meal together. Thank you to all the wonderful hosts! The ninth series will begin in 2017.
- Men's Breakfast: At least once per month, the men in the church are invited to gather for breakfast at the Country Griddle in Flemington. The socialization and laughter is very welcome.
- Golf Outing: Our third annual golf outing was held at the Hopewell Valley Golf Club. Thank you to Christine O. and Paul A. as another time of fun and fundraising was had my many.
- Koinonia Retreat: thanks to Chris S., many gathered at the Koinonia retreat center in New York for our third annual church retreat. A great time was had and we look forward to holding this event each year.
- Epiphany Party: held every year at Dan and Mary Kate's.

These mission projects and fellowship, their support and desire to continue to be involved with them come from our heart and our minds where we seek to be instruments of Christ's peace and love here on earth. To come to this point, in addition to our worship celebrations, mission projects, and fellowship, we gather on a regular basis for Christian and Religious Education.

#### **EDUCATION**

- Story Circle during worship for those 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and below. Thank you Carol for hosting and sharing those important Bible stories!
- Teen Sunday School: Led by Bill, and Michaela, our teens (ages @13-18) are offered a Bible Study lesson before worship over at the church office from 10:00-10:45 am. This is a wonderful component of our church program and we are blessed to have it in our midst.
- Confirmation: no one this year but we look forward to more in the future.
- Adult Bible Study:
  - -Wed. (9:30 am.) adult study meets at Grateful Bites in Flemington.
  - -Wednesday evening Bible Study meets at the church office at 7 pm.

These small groups continue to be great gatherings of support as we question, learn and process our faith and life journeys.

#### **COUNCIL**

None of the above could have happened without the ongoing support and vision of Grace UCC's council.

Mike S. is our moderator. Thank you Mike as you lead us forward.

Christine O. is our vice-moderator. She leads us well as well...

Stein S. is our secretary...a great writer!

Bill T. is our Treasurer and we are blessed to have him continue to do all those things needed, oftentimes behind the scenes, of our church.

Christine S. is our financial secretary. She has done a great job and we are so blessed to have her on the council.

Our deacons for 2016: Christine O., Bill T., Kathleen S. (who has gone off council this year- thank you Kathleen!), Stein S., Kelly O., Jeanne T., and Peggy T. Thank you to you all as you continue to help minister to the congregation. # Treasurer's Annual Report for 2016



This is my first Annual Report as Treasurer. As background, I became Treasurer as of the beginning of the year, when Mike Sisco was elevated from Treasurer to Council Moderator. It has been my honor to volunteer with the rest of Council in managing the financial affairs of the church. And along those lines, it is important that I first acknowledge that I am very much aided in my responsibilities by Jeanne Taylor, who has graciously continued to take responsibility for aggregating and paying our various bills. Jeanne's contribution has been invaluable and has allowed me to spend the majority of my time making sure our financial transactions are properly captured, categorized and reported to Council on a monthly basis.

Over the course of this first year, I have become better familiar and comfortable with the financial condition of our church. Grace UCC was started in 2004 and has been in existence for only 12 years. In my opinion, we are in a very enviable position financially given our young age. As of the end of November, we have \$73,624 in our Operating account and \$21,409 in our Savings account.

# **Financial Strength**

We have no debt burden and minimal facility maintenance. We don't own a building. We don't have a mortgage obligation. And we don't have significant facility maintenance costs. We are blessed to have a good relationship with the Flemington Women's Center and the use of their facility every Sunday morning at a very attractive price.

## **Financial Threat**

We rely almost 100% on the donations of members. Currently, a significant portion of our revenue comes from a very small number of members. That is not usual for a relatively new church with a small membership base. But it would be advisable to make every effort to grow our donor base/membership in order to reduce the revenue concentration risk on a small number of households.



# **2016 Financial Results**

- As of the end of November, we are having a good year. Our revenue exceeds our expenses by \$8,361.
- So far this year, donations made through PayPal are now 14% of our total revenue and continues to grow. That is a very positive development because most PayPal donations are set up on an automatic monthly basis. That means the donations to the church are received consistently, even if the donor's attendance is inconsistent.
- We received a \$6,240 grant from the UCC to assist the Small Family with caring for their son. Because 100% of the grant was earmarked for that specific purpose, both our revenue and the associated expenses were increased by that exact same amount.
- Based upon the results through November, projected Full Year 2016 results are expected to fall short of our budget by about \$5,000. That shortfall is directly attributable to the anticipated Council decision to make a catch up payment into our pastor's pension plan. We have only made the required pension payments since 2011 (5 years). No payments were made during the church's first 7 years.

# **Budget for 2017**

## Revenue assumptions:

- Revenue from Sunday offerings is expected to remain flat.
- Other (non-restricted) revenue is expected to be \$700 lower because we are no longer subleasing our office.
- Restricted revenue will be \$6,240 lower because of no housing grant.



# Expense assumptions:

- Staff related expenses, which included the additional \$5,000 pension plan payment, are expected to remain flat. The extra \$5,000 will be used next year to cover salary increases and/or additional pension plan payments.
- With the exception of Missions expenses, all other expenses are assumed to be consistent with 2016.
- Mission expenses are assumed to be \$6,240 less because of no housing grant.

# Surplus results:

• 2017 Budget surplus of \$8,000 is expected to be slightly better than what is being projected for 2016.
